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Salary range will be determined by educational attainment.

A. High school education or acceptable equivalency. \$13,128 annually.

B. A relevant AA or AS degree from an accredited college or university.

Applicants must be at least 20 years of age, be a citizen of the United States, be a graduate of an accredited high school or have evidence of high school equivalency, and be of good moral character with a clean law observance background. Applicants must also possess uncorrected visual acuity of not less than 20-40 bilaterally, correctible to 202 bilaterally; and successfully complete a color deficiency test.
