

# Best Records You Can Select For Christmas Presents?

**Dr. Bernice Johnson Reagon**, vivacious 31-year-old director of the Smithsonian Program in Black American Culture, is vocal about her commitment to let the world know about the on-going contributions American Blacks have made, particularly as expressed in the performing arts.

Reagon is hardly a musty bureaucrat. The former SNCC Freedom Singer is a member of the acappella quartet Sweet Honey In The Rock. Honey recently celebrated their eighth anniversary with two sold-out standing ovation concerts at Howard University Law Center. They'll be in New York City December 4 and Lexington, KY. on December 5; their third album is due from Flying Fish Records before Christmas.

It should come as no surprise, then, that some of the best records that you can select for Christmas presents this year are from Reagon's department at the Smithsonian.

Reagon herself selected the cuts for the three disc "Voices Of The Civil Rights Movement." Ranging from uptempo to mournful soul

filled ballads, the dynamic expression of Black America's struggle for freedom is much too good musically to gather dust on the shelf. The lucky recipient will play this set over and over. \$21.48. Order on the Smithsonian's toll-free watts line.

Dr. Reagon tells me the 1973 entry, the six-record "Smithsonian Collection Of Classic Jazz" has now earned platinum status. Drawn from the archives of seventeen record companies, you'll find Scott Joplin playing "Maple Leaf Rag," John Coltrane playing "Alabama," Bessie Smith's "St. Louis Blues," Jelly Roll Morton's "Black Bottom Stomp" and much more. \$40.98.

Two new Ellington albums have

been introduced. "Symphony In Black" is a complete performance, for the first time, of his film score which won an Academy Award in

1935. The movie featured the young Billie Holiday. The Smithsonian Jazz Repertory Ensemble cut the disc. \$9.98. Ellington himself is captured on a double album "Duke Ellington 1941." Included are "Take The 'A' Train" and "Perdido" and 30 other superb selections from RCA's archives. \$15.23.

What else might make the perfect Christmas gift? "The George Benson Collection" is a solid two-record package, with everything from "White Rabbit" to his latest "Love All The Hurt Away" duet with Aretha Franklin. It's on Warner Brothers.

And Aretha's "Love All The Hurt Away" album is one of her best ever. Industry critics have lauded Diana Ross for her first self-produced RCA album, "Why Do Fools Fall In Love." At the risk of becoming a target for bricks thrown by Ross fans, I can only say I think she'll have to self-produce several more to really reach her potential. Her live performances, however, have never been better.

A superb, innovative mood album has been released by Tangerine Dream on Elektra. Called

"Exit," the imaginative, multi-lingual disc is the West Berlin trio's fifteenth. They cut the highly acclaimed soundtrack for "Thief."

In closing, here's a list of some artists I found somewhat unspectacular: Del Shannon, Lindsey Buckingham, The Jones Girls, Crusaders, Rossington Collins

Band, Lenny Williams, Bill Summers and Rufus with Chaka Khan. Maybe they'll click with their next albums; this year's offerings struck me more as formula schlock.
