Statesville Avenue Church Celebrates 30th Anniversary

Statesville Avenue United Presbyterian Church began its charge in 1952 when it was formally established as a church. Now three decades later the church is celebrating its 30th anniversary.

In 1949 the Catawba Synod of the Presbyterian Church of the United States of America began work to overhaul its outmoded churches and to put new churches where they were needed.

At first renovation and improvement projects by local congregations were stressed. However, the congregation and presbyteries decided they would team together at the synod level to tackle church extension and many other projects.

In Catawba Presbytery a survey was made by the Trustees in the Double Oaks area of Charlotte. The survey produced evidence that mission work was needed in the area and the presbytery felt that the opportunity could not be passed up.

On April 14, 1950 two lots were purchased at Statesville Avenue Terrace by the trustees of Catawba Presbytery. On July 1, 1951 the Rev. Thomas A. Jenkins was placed in charge of the work. At his appointment definite plans were started as he explored the possibilities of a new Presbyterian church.

After much effort and hard word Rev. Jenkins finally succeeded in gathering a small group together. The group made clear and emphatic that they were interested in a church, not a mission.

They decided to meet on Sunday mornings for worship services without the knowledge of a meeting place. Through the work of Rev. Dr. Raymond Worsley, who at the time was an employee of the Parks and Recreation Center and director of Double Oaks Recreation Center, permission was granted to meet in the recreational hall.

Morning worship service began. Those who pledge their support and expressed their willingness to join the new congregation were Wilburn M. Sanders, Oscar L. Flowe, Raymond Worsley, Mary C. Flowe, Rudolph Worsley, Luther Ross, Ed Robinson, Eva Robinson, Dorothy Robinson, Viola Robinson, Aurelia Worsley, John Rorie, Romeo Alexander, Mildred Sanders, Joseph Hall, Anna Taylor, John Gaston, Edna Gaston, Dr. G. A. Lowe, W. J. Harrison, Carolyn Harrison, Mildred Archie, Doris Pharr and Julia Robinson.

In addition to meeting at the Double Oaks Recreation center, the group met in the homes of supporters, in a vacant apartment on Double Oaks Road, and in the assembly room of the headquarters of a Brick and Mason's Union.

On January 27, 1952 with 17 charter members present, the Statesville Ave. United Presbyterian Church was formed at a formal service at the Biddeville Presbyterian
