Vomiting and diarrhea in children are frequently signs of an illness called gastroenteritis.

While some gastroenteritis may be caused by bacteria, most are due to viruses or "flu."

If a child loses a lot of fluid through vomiting and diarrhea, he may show signs of dehydration or fluid loss. These signs include decreased urination, dry mouth, sunken eyes, floppiness, or a sunken soft spot on a baby's head. If any of these signs are present, you should bring the child to a doctor, immediately.

Treatment for uncomplicated vomiting or diarrhea consists of stopping all milk and food and feeding the child clear liquids (apple juice, Coke, etc.) for 24 hours. If symptoms persist, see your doctor.

Senator Walker Urges:

"Get Involved You Can Make A Difference"

Senator Russell G. Walker, chairman of the North Carolina Democratic Party, Monday urged people to "get involved on matters of governmental policy that concern you. You can make a difference."

As an example, he pointed out the recent announcement that more stringent policies on tobacco and health had been announced by Dr. C. Everett Koop, Surgeon General of the U.S., and Secretary Richard Schweiker of Health and Human Services.

"This prompted a response by our own Governor Jim Hunt as you would expect. But at the same time, in a press conference held in our State Democratic Headquarters, a group of tobacco farmers raised their voices against the unfairness. They cited a campaign promise from candidate Reagan, made while he was running for office, that differed from his administration's current performance."

"Now, no one can say that one or two protests can make a big difference. But about the same time that

these were voiced, the White House did amend its position on this issue that concerns so many North Carolinians.

"I believe it's because many voices were heard, and Congressmen of both parties are sensitive to

what they hear from the home folks."

The Democratic Chairman made the point that the three tobacco farmers voicing their objectives came from both major parties. Two were Democrats but one was a regis-

tered Republican. "On a key issue affecting them all, they stood together. This is how you make things happen."
