Reagan Wants To Lift Poor Into The Joy Of Independency?

The Reagan Administration has coined a new word form to describe what it wants to do for

blacks-create "independency."
Elizabeth H. Dole, special assistant to the president for public liason, in a commencement address at Livingstone College, said that the Reagan Administration-through aid to black colleges, training programs, loans to minority businessmen and urban enterprise zones-wants to "lift the poor out of dependency into the joys of independency.'

Paraphrasing a line by black poet Langston Hughes, Mrs. Dole remarked, "My friends, too many Americans have tragic knowledge of dreams deferred."

Mrs. Dole suggested that old government promises of a "better day ahead" had been made a "mockery" by the economic strain felt by black families as grocery bills escalated and small businesses folded, ending many job op-portunities. Reagan's economic program will improve life for blacks, she promised, by eliminating waste in government programs and providing avenues for ambitious people" to succeed.

A native of Salisbury, Mrs. Dole was awarded an honorary doctor of humane letters degree at Livingstone's commencement ceremonies.

Governor Jim Hunt has appointed 14 members, including Marilea R. Grogan of Charlotte, to serve on the Council on Developmental Disabilities.
