

"How To Do Business With The Federal Government"

North Carolina business people can learn "How To Do Business With The Federal Government" at a day-long conference by that title on Thursday, October 27, at the Charlotte Civic Center.

The conference is sponsored by U.S. Representative Jim Martin, and co-sponsored by the Greater Charlotte Chamber of Commerce, the U.S. Small Business Administration, the Business Division of the North Carolina Department of Commerce and the National Federation of Independent Business.

The conference is designed to increase awareness of the types of goods and services needed by the federal government and its prime contractors. With the cooperation of the U.S. Departments of Commerce and Defense, the conference is planned to focus on the opportunities North Carolina businesses may have to sell to the federal government.

The fee pays for the program, lunch and printed materials. Checks should be received no later

Prime government contractors such as Burroughs Wellcome Co., Burlington Industries, Inc., Ingersoll-Rand Co., Irvin Industries, Inc., Stancil Arco Engineering Corp., Transamerica Delaval, Inc., and Western Electric Co., Inc., will be on hand to provide information to partici-

pants.

Registration will begin at 8 a.m. After a brief welcome and explanation of the program, counseling and seminar sessions will start at 9:30 a.m. The sessions will include information on export opportunities and how to prepare bids. Representative of federal agencies will be on

hand to assist and advise those attending.

C.C. Hope Jr., North Carolina Secretary of Commerce, will be keynote speaker at the 12:30 luncheon. Other speakers will include George M. Morgan, chairman of the Chamber's Economic Development Division; Thomas B. Broughton,

director of the Business Assistance Division of the N.C. Department of Commerce; William C. Bender, federal-civilian coordinator, U.S. Department of Commerce; and Juanita Watts, Department of Defense coordinator.

Conference activities are expected to conclude around 3:30 p.m.
