**Kwick**  
"Foreplay"  
If nothing else will peak your curiosity about the new group KWICK, surely the album's title will cause some eyebrows to raise.

Foreplay by Kwick lays somewhere between soul and rock. A lot of emphasis is placed on electric guitar solos and although their sound is uniquely theirs, there is some reminders of modern music innovators like Prince.

Foreplay begins with M-TV, Too Lonely To Be Alone. (I have to comment on this one. It's a weird ballad about a guy whose girl has left him. Desiring no replacement he decides to make love to himself (I'll

let you form your own opinions on that). Foreplay continues with Stuck Up, I've Been Watching You (Watching Me), Don't Know What To Do About You, I'll Get You Right and "Will You?"

### Dazz Band

"Joysticks"  
Mostly concentrating on dance music the Dazz Band's latest project Joystick does venture into the world of ballads with Now That I Have You and Until You. But what's surprisingly delightful is the jazz instrumental piece, T Mata. It definitely highlights the Dazz Band's musical diversity.

On Side Two there's Rock With Me, Straight Out of School, Now That I Have You, Laughin' At You and T Mata.

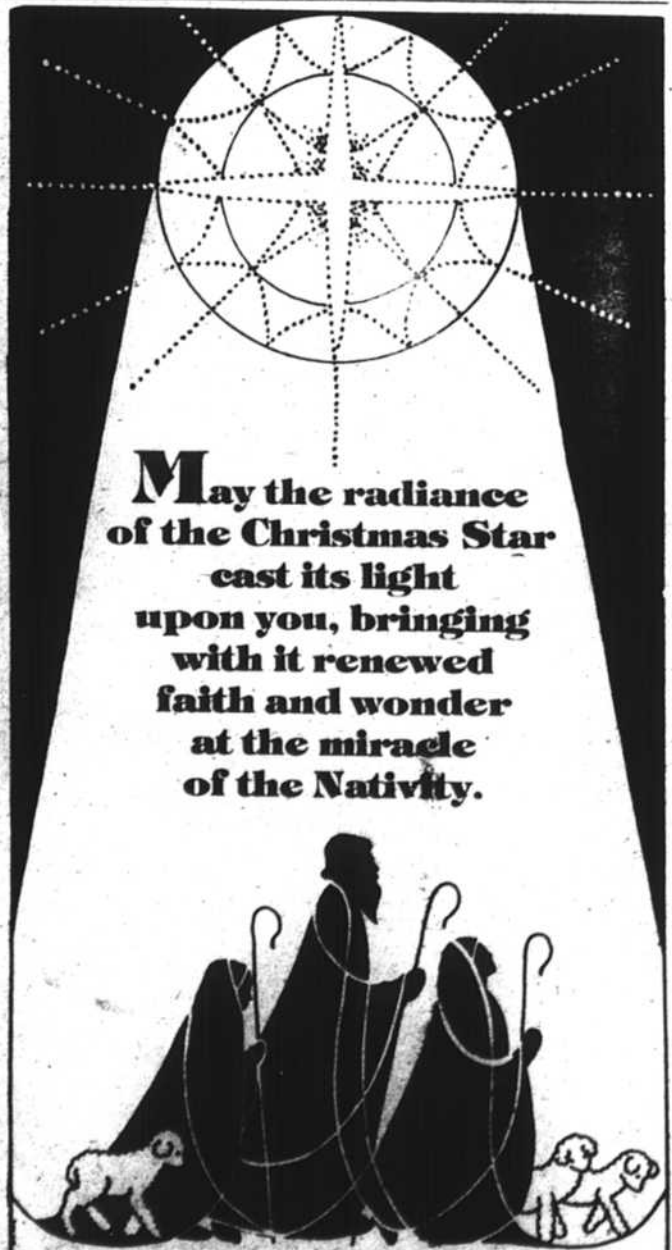
