Dr. Burkette Named Staff Associate For Presbyterian Church, USA

Post Managing Editor Dr. Tyrone Burkette, a Minnesota pastor, will join the staff of the Synod of North Carolina, Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), as Staff Associate for Synod Ministries, effective February 1.

His duties will include helping coordinate several specific kinds of work in the Synod's programs. Dr. Burkette is senior pastor of the Dayton Avenue Presbyterian Church in St. Paul, Minnesota, a position he has held since 1975.

Rev. Dudley Crawford is chairman of the search committee that selected Dr. Burkette. "Dr. Burkette has the kind of per-sonality we felt will be important to accomplishing the tasks of the Synod in the next few years," Rev. Crawford commented. In summary the committee felt Dr. Burkette has the skills and competencies for the job, a good record in administering a parish ministry, and considerable involvement in the world of higher levels of the church."

Dr. Burkette will also be involved in the transition work within North Carolina's reunion of the two Presbyterian denominations: one predominantly in the South and the other in the rest of the country. The two former denomina-tions had split in the Civil War. Most members of the former Southern church in North Carolina are white, while most members of the other, United Presbyterian Church, in the state are Black. Dr. Burkette added that he hopes to aid a smoother transition to a re-

united church.

Dr. Burkette holds a doctor of ministry degree from United Theological Seminary in Minnesota. He and his wife, Dorothy, have two children-Gordon, 18' and Michelle, 10. He is a member of the General Assem-bly's Committee revising the directory of worship.


