The Charlotte Police Deartment's Crime Prevenon Unit helps us recognize suspicious activity in he following categories: Suspicious Activity

Involving Persons Persons going door-toloor in a residential area, specially if one or more ersons go to rear of residence. Possible burglary suspects or trespass-

Persons waiting or loitering in front of a house or business, if house is unoccupied or business is closed. Possible burglar

suspects. Persons forcing entrance or entering a house you know is unoccupied. Pos-sible burglary, theft or trespassing.

Person running, es-ecally if something of salve is being carried a lift's at an unusual flour. this suspect fleeing the e suspect fleeing the arglary or robbery.

Person screaming. Pos-ole rape or assault. Person loitering around car or going from car to car peering into them, especially in parking lots or on streets. Possible car

Persons loitering around schools, parks or secluded areas. Possible sex of-fenders or drug dealers. Persons offering items

for sale at a very low price.
Possibly trying to sell stolen property.
Strangers loitering or slowly walking through pood times. Possible burglary suspects or vandals.

Suspicious Activity Involving Vehicles Slow moving vehicle without lights, especially if its course appears aimless. Possible burglary, drug pusher or sex offender

Parked or occupied vehicle containing one or more persons, especially significant if observed at an unusual hour. Possible lookouts for a burglary or robbery, Vehicles being loaded

with valuables, if parked by an unoccupied residence or closed business. Posthe burglary in progress.
Recently abandoned ve-ticle, especially one bear-ing no signs that the driver and mechanical trouble.

ages or storage areas if

accumulated in large quantities and-or items are in good condition but not in use. Possible stolen proper-

Continuous repair operations at a non-business location. Possible stolen

How To Report A Crime If you observe any of the suspicious activities described above, call 911 immediately. The longer you wait to call the police, the greater the chances are that the suspect will get away.

Here are some guidelines to follow:

1. When the 911-Emergency Operator: answers, say, "I'm calling in re-ference to a possible...," and name the type of crime you suspect. You need not go into detail at this point.

2. Give your name and location. If you don't know the block number, give the closest cross street or intersection.

3. Stand by to answer further questions, if necessary. The 911-Emergency Operator is trained to get the necessary information in order to dispatch a car and to advise the officer about just the barest facts

.Micah won't see this story about him. At birth his eye nerves were damaged, and he may never have useful sight. Brain damage affected his muscle control, so that without medication, his arms or legs may stiffen, limiting normal progress of crawling, walking or using his hands

In his first year of life, he

received little special care of therapy. Then he entered foster care where an experienced foster parent took on the challenge. In his second year he began to show slow, but important progress. He now receives medications to relax his muscles and to help him sleep normally. He responds to sound and to being touched, grins and shows pleasure (instead of crying all the time).

His physical development is progressing well, and his foster mother believes he is more aware of things around him than he's able to show. Once he gains a skill, such as relaxing his arm and touching his hands together, he masters it and repeats it. He now has better control of his left hand, and is getting control of his arm muscles.

Micah would certainly benefit from having a permanent family.
