## osing Schools For Weather

Special To The Post Winter is back upon us and with it comes the po-tential need to periodically close schools because of inclement weather. In CMS, two methods are considered whenever the weather is threatening delayed opening and complete closing.

Under the delayed opening procedure, schools would delay their normal opening time by two hours. Such a delay, however, would not affect the time of dismissal which would remain on the normal sched-

If the weather is severe all schools will be closed. Usually, however, administrative offices, including the Education. Center, will remain open.
In both instances, the

ecision to close or delay the opening of school is a

major one. Primary "firstalert" responsibility is placed in the system's Security Department which monitors weather conditions as early as 3:30 a.m. If inclement weather

develops, Security personnel notify appropriate administrators who acti-vate the CMS "Road Runners." The Road Runners (mostly CMS Transport-ation Specialists) actually drive roads to check con-ditions. Additional input is received from the National Weather Service, the High-way Patrol and local law

enforcement agencies.

A consensus of opinion dictates the decision on whether to delay opening the The decision is made at 5:30 a.m. (or earlier if possible) and all media outlets are notified by 6 a.m. If you do not hear from us before mat time,

you can confidently ssume that there will be school in CMS that day.

If schools have been closed for a day, it can be assumed that they will reopen the following day un-less we tell you otherwise. If schools are to be closed or delayed an additional day, we will make such an announcement following the procedure outlines

Infrequently, schools are forced to close dur the school day. In those instances, the safety of the students is of primary concern. But, there are some logistical considerations which have to be studied as well, primarily the question of whither or not we have allowed suf-ficient time for buses to be refueled and serviced in order to insure their making the run home.
