At UNCC, it is our belief that education is one of the keys which unlocks the door to a life full of quality and meaning. It also enables us to direct our lives and achieve our goals.

Our purpose is to furnish you with a quality education—one that provides you with a feeling of self-confidence and competence. The University is committed to increasing the racial diversity of its student body and increasing the number of black students enrolled. This increases the learning experiences of all students and is more representative of the society in which we live.

We also recognize that black students, as with other ethnic groups, have that need to be a part of the whole, but to identify with and participate in those organizations and programs that are culture specific. Here at UNCC, black students are an integral part of the University programs at every level. They are also represented by the Black Student Union, the Children of the Sun Choir and the Minority Program Committee. UNCC has 22 fraternities and sororities on campus, including Delta Sigma Theta, Alpha Kappa Alpha, Alpha Phi Alpha, Omega Psi Phi, Kappa Alpha Psi and Sigma Pi Phi.

The Afro-American Studies program is designed to enable all University students to come to an awareness of black people—who they are, where they come from, what they are doing and why. This is a special experience for students, and the courses are designed to fulfill University general degree requirements.

Black faculty and staff are represented in many departments—such as sociology, business administration, nursing and student affairs. They extend a special invitation to you to meet and talk with them.

At UNCC, we offer you a learning experience which will be the basis for everything else you do. We care about you, and we invite you to come visit us.

the admissions process

UNCC's doors are open to all qualified men and women regardless of religion, race, color, handicap or national origin. Applicants for undergraduate admission should present 18 academic units from high school, 13 of which must be academic courses. Courses are preferred 10 include four units of English, three units of mathematics (Algebra I and II and Geometry), two units of social science, one unit of natural science and two units of the same foreign language.

In evaluating your application, your four-year high school record is the most important factor. We also will evaluate your SAT or ACT scores, recommendations and extracurricular activities and interests. A high school equivalency certificate may be submitted in lieu of a secondary school diploma. Applications are processed on a first-come, first-served basis, and students will be notified of the admissions decision as soon as all necessary documents have been received and evaluated.

Certain majors are more in demand than others and you may have to present higher test scores or complete additional prerequisite courses to be admissible.

courses of study

The academic program at UNCC is made up of the College of Arts and Sciences and five professional schools—Architecture, Business Administration, Engineering, Human Development and Learning (Education) and Nursing. These colleges specialize in one or more disciplines to offer you more than 40 undergraduate degree options in 28 departments, including Afro-American and African Studies—a program designed to enable all University students to come to an awareness of black people. AAA Studies is open to all undergraduates either as a major leading to the B.A. degree or as elective courses complementary to their major program.
