### expenses

Tuition costs for the regular academic year for a typical full-time North Carolina student are \$648, while tuition for a typical out-of-state atudent is \$2,436, annually. On-campus housing ranges from \$990 to \$1,290 per year and food from \$830 to \$1,076 an-nually, depending upon the options chosen. Other expenses to consider are books (\$200 to \$380 per year), special supplies, clothing, laundry, transportation, entertainment, etc. The Univer-sity reserves the right to make, with the approval of proper authorities, changes in tuition and fees at any time.

### financial aid

Financial assistance is available in several forms-scholarships, grants-in-sid, foens and part-time employment on campus and off. A financial problem should not deter you from submitting an application. The University makes every effort within the limits of available resources to encourage and assist students in securing an adacation. Black students are eligible for con-sideration for Minority Presence Grants in addition to other forms of financial aid.

Do not walt on an edmissions decision to apply for financial aid. There are three main steps in applying for financial aid. (1) To apply for all financial aid (except certain scholarships and guaranteed student loans), complete and mail: (a) Financial Aid Form (FAF) and (b) UNCC Financial Aid Form. (2) The FAF may be obtained from your high school principal or guidance counselor or the UNCC Financial Aid Office. The UNCC Finan-cial Aid Request Form may also be obtained from the campus Financial Aid Office. (3) The FAF is usually available in January and should be submitted as soon as possible. Delay could cause a student to lose blafter chance at available funds. Check the FAF for deadline dates. (For FAF purposes, the UNCC code is 5105.)

# housing

UNCC offers one of the most unique housing programs in the country, providing a small college experience in a metropolitan university environment. Freshmen may choose one of two op-tions; (1) a room for two in a high else residence hall or (2) a suite for four with two bedrooms, den and bath in a four-story hall. Upperclassmen have their choice of these two options or an apartment for four with four bedrooms, living/dining area, bath and kichten. Rooms, suites and apartments are air condition-ed and electrically heated with laundry and recreation rooms accessible to all. Professional staff, student floor advisers and apartment managers work with students in all residence facilities to develop an atmosphere conducive to academic and personal growth.


