For three years Joyce has patiently waited for her prospective husband to save enough money for the legal fees. Simple's money never makes it out the door of Paddy's Bar, the neigh- borhood social and philo-

sophic center for the Har- lem Neighborhood. Jesse's wallet doesn't stand a chance in the presence of Zarita, an alluring, lively and fun-loving girl who considers Simple a ticket for a good time.

In all 17 characters in- habit Langston Hughes' world within Paddy's Bar, spilling their life woes and dreams. Paddy's is a place of refuge from the sweat- shops and the overcrowded tenements. Some use it as a temporary way station such as Hopkins the bar- tender. An aspiring writer

who uses his skills more as an arbitrator among pa- trons, Hopkins can't quite get a handle on what it is he wants to write about. But he does make a mean Singapore Sling. Miss Mamie, Bodaddy, Melon and Archie are long on advice, short on cash and quick to slip a laugh as Jesse Simple revolves through the door of his
