Greensboro - "If I didn't have bad luck I wouldn't have any luck at all!" Sound familiar? Well, there's more to fishing than just luck and fishing enthusiasts can now learn how to eliminate practically the luck factor in fishing by attending the American Fishing Institute (AFI) at the University of North Carolina in Greensboro, N.C., on March 10-11.

Since 1972, this awardwinning two-day fishing course, conducted by Indiana State University, has brought the fun and excitement of fishing to over 18,000 anglers across the nation by providing instruction in sound fishing techniques utilizing the talents of America's foremost professional anglers as instructors.

The primary instruction is conducted in eight onehour long General Sessions. 
