Later, he began buying his own models and building them. When high school days rolled around it seemed only natural for him to enter the Airforce ROTC program at West Mecklenburg High School. From his instructor, Lt. Colonel Ken Smith, he

learned one of life's most valuable lessons: "He always told me I could do anything I wanted to. Things will come if you work hard enough." Thus we have a success story.

After graduating and working one year for an insurance company, Sgt. Brown entered the Air Force as Airman First Class (two stripes). What regularly takes two years to achieve he accomplished in eight months; he became a Senior Airman (three stripes). For his fourth stripe, he was tested in two parts - one part about the general regulations and history of the Air Force, and the second about his specific area. So far, he has shown limitless leadership abilities. He was named "Maintenance Person of the Month" and was the day shift supervisor. During this time, the staff's production and quality of work improved because of the training programs instigated by Sgt. Brown. All of accomplishments were reflected on his evaluations.

Sgt. Brown is the son of Mary L. Brown of Charlotte. He is a member of Progressive Baptist Church.

Perhaps Sgt. Brown's many successes spring from the confidence he has acquired from working hard, "I believe there are opportunities for everyone regardless of race. But you must work hard because nothing is given free to anyone."


