blic building bond. The \$32.7 million bond will fund construction of a 313,000 square foot government center to house City and County Services and offices, and a 780-space parking deck. The building site is the block bordered by Third, Fourth, Alexander and Davidson Streets. The parking deck site is the block bordered by Third, Fouth, Davidson, and Caldwell Streets. The Mayor's City Office Space Study Committee, a

The Mayor's City Office Space Study Committee, a citizens' committee appointed in August, 1982, determined that the City could saved \$24 million over the next 30 years by building its own office space rather than continuing to lease. The City currently pays approximately \$1 million annually to lease space for City offices that would be housed in the new center.

The City-County government center will centralize most local government administrative offices in one building for the first time. The features of the center include a meeting chamber for the City Council and County Commission with adequate seating for neighborhood groups and other citizens speaking at public meetings and hearings. The current 40-seat meeting chamber for City Council was designed in 1924 to serve a population of 46,000.
