Martin Seeks Candidates For Academies

Representative Jim Martin (R-NC) is seeking young men and women who might be interested in receiving a free college education while pursuing a career as an officer in the armed forces.

Congressman Martin said he is currently receiving applications from high school juniors who are interested in attending West Point, Annapolis, the Air Force Academy, or the Merchant Marine Academy. The Congressman stressed that nominations are based solely on the recommendations of non-partisan review panels for each academy.

Each military institution offers a full four year college education at no cost to the appointee or their parents. Also, all medical and dental benefits are provided at no cost to the students.

Playwright Erskay Freeman and five other cast members will dramatize vignettes of Benjamin Banneker, self-taught astronomer and mathematician; Jan Ernest Matzeliger, inventor of a machine to mass produce shoes; and Dr. Daniel Hale Williams, first to perform open heart surgery in 1893. A skit in which a typical family attempts to go through one day without conveniences developed by blacks follow. (Throw out the refrigerator, beds, lamps, iron, and sewing machine for starters.)

mittee to seek out and nominate to the Governor the best qualified persons to hold judicial office.
