Culture Club

"Colour By Numbers" Why have teen-agers suddenly gone mad about a group who call themselves Culture Club and whose lead singer, Boy George, dresses in outrageous and extravagant attire?

I certainly won't try to answer that question but I can understand the attraction to the group's music.

Boy George has the kind of voice that overcomes most musical barriers. His

style is not pop nor is it rock, but his appeal seems to be to everyone who would either consider themselves a rock-n-roller or popper. The music Culture Club plays is not harsh or loud, but has a pleasing, soothing effect. The one thing I don't understand is the lyrics. Lines like: "On the street they're preaching violence. Mr. Man it's in your head. On the street the midnight cowboy needs no gun to shoot you dead." I find quite bewildering.

Their latest album, "Colour By Numbers," include "Karma Chameleon," "It's A Miracle," "Black Money," "Changing Every Day," and "That's The Way (I'm Only Trying To Help You)".
