The North Carolina Democratic Party's Convention will convene at 1 p.m. on Saturday, June 16 at the Raleigh Civic Center. Some 2,000 delegates from across the state are expected to attend.

The Honorable Harvey B. Gantt, Mayor of Charlotte, will address the convention as a featured speaker.

The Charleston, South Carolina native was elected to his current post in 1983. His previous experience in government includes service as a member of the Charlotte City Council and as Mayor Pro Tem of Charlotte.

**Davidson Receives \$24,000 Undergraduate Scholarship**

The Dow Chemical Company Foundation of Michigan has established a four-year Dow Undergraduate Scholarship in chemistry at Davidson through a grant of \$24,000.

The scholarship, awarded solely on the basis of merit and potential for a career in chemistry, provides \$5,000 annually for four years to an outstand-

ing high school senior who pursues a major in chemistry. The scholarship is renewable each year provided the student maintains a 3.0 grade point average.

The program will also provide a \$1,000 chemistry department discretionary grant. During this four-year period, the chemistry department will provide

assistance to nearby high school chemistry programs.

"This significant grant will help the department recruit talented students who seek careers in chemistry and will strengthen the quality of our total curriculum in chemistry," said Dr. J. N. Burnett, chairman of Davidson's chemistry department.

"We appreciate the support of one of the nation's major chemical corporations at a critical step in the preparation of future Ph.D.'s."

Davidson was one of 40 institutions in the country selected to participate in the scholarship program. Among other colleges selected were Pomona, Harvey Mudd, Occidental,

Reed, Carleton, and Grinnell Colleges and Bucknell University.

Davidson College, located in Davidson, N.C., is a 147-year old Presbyterian liberal arts college. Davidson currently enrolls 1,371 men and women students, and its distinguished alumni include President Woodrow Wilson, former U.S. Secre-

tary of State Dean Rusk, presidents of several major corporations, prominent physicians, lawyers, ministers and educators.
