The 1984 Black College Football Campaign has slipped up on us! The CIAA lists five contests and there are three games involving as many MEAC schools Saturday.

Local football fans will have a choice of five games. The top attraction is the big battle between North Carolina Central and Livingstone is Salisbury Saturday afternoon. The other attractions include the JCSU-Virginia Union tussle in Richmond, Bowie State at St. Paul's, Tennessee State at Hampton, and Virginia State at Winston-Salem State in the CIAA. South Carolina State will journey to Greenville, S.C., to tackle Furman in the afternoon while Central Florida engages Bethune-Cookman and Howard entertains Rhode Island in the MEAC contests.

With 19 starters returning from last year's team, coach Mel Rose has an excellent opportunity to capture the Southern Division title, a first-time honor for Livingstone College. In addition to the benefits of having had a good recruiting year, Rose has top-quality threats in kicking specialist Paul Ford and highly explosive JoJo White, who has scooted for 3,007 career yards. He rushed for 221 yards a game in 1983. Ford kicked 57 field goals last year.

It would appear that coach Billy Hayes has bitten off more than he can chew. His Winston-Salem State Rams, one of the teams the experts say will contend for the Southern Division crown, will face five top-ranked opponents in the first five weeks of the new season.

Hayes opens the season Saturday night against Virginia State in Winston-Salem. Then, in successive weeks, he is scheduled to challenge A&T in Greensboro and North Carolina Central in Durham before facing Virginia Union in a night game in Winston-Salem. The Rams will be in Salisbury on Saturday, October 6, engaging Livingstone's Fighting Blue Bears.

Homecoming will be celebrated October 27, with Winston-Salem State as the CIAA opponent.

Johnson C. Smith's football roster has a few surprises. The Bulls, for example, successfully recruited 13 athletes from South Carolina and they carrolled only five from North Carolina. Three players, junior noseguard John Logan, senior tackle Robert Wright and freshman Randy Green each list their playing weight at 280 pounds. Forty-five of the 67 athletes weigh more than 200 pounds while 21 roster players tip the scales at less than 200. Sophomore running back Jeff Easterling is the smallest person on the squad. He weighs a mere 155.

Coach Small and his staff had more success in recruiting players from Florida and South Carolina than they did in North Carolina. Of the 30 newcomers to the team, 15 are from South Carolina and eight are from Florida. Four of

the rookies are from the ol' home state.
