effort, getting another block, and making sure his presence is known on the field,


You might wonder how Steve might prepare himself to go against men who usually outweigh him by 30 to 40 pounds?

To Steve, being small has its advantages. Since he is smaller than opponents, he is usually quicker, and knowing that he is smaller makes him play that much harder.




