The achievements of America's more than 600,000 minority businesses will be celebrated in an extensive series of official events to be held throughout the nation during the week of October 7-13, which has been proclaimed Minority Enterprise Development Week by President Reagan. Two dozen award-winning minority business finalists from around the country will be feted in Washington by the Minority Business Development Agency and the Small Business Administration.

The wide-ranging program of meetings with top government leaders, members of Congress and senior private sector executives will culminate in the naming of the Minority Entrepreneur of the Year. Selection of the second annual award winner will be made from among nominees in four principal categories - manufacturing, construction, services and retailing - who best exemplify minority business personal achievement and contributions to the national economy.

Additional awards will recognize the contributions of the corporate community as well as those in our nation's institutions, trade associations, and state and local governments to the cause and furtherance of minority business.

The Presidential Proclamation describes the minority business community as "a dynamic force in our nation's economy...bringing innovative products and services to the marketplace...and providing jobs and training for thousands of American workers."

Established by Executive Order in 1969, when minority-owned businesses numbered about 332,000, the Minority Business Development Agency promotes and encourages minority business ownership.
