The North Carolina High School Athletic Association is considering action that could cause changes in the scope of high school athletics in the state of North Carolina that would be monumental.

The Academics and Attendance Committee has recommended that a student be required to pass four subjects for the previous semester in order to obtain athletic eligibility.

This year, the requirement is three with one being academic.

The attendance regulation would be raised to 75 percent during the previous semester.
