If you are one of the people who never got around to registering to vote, you are still entitled to vote in the presidential election. Federal law mandates that every otherwise eligible citizen be allowed to cast a ballot for the nation's highest office. This applies to those who may have moved into the county too recently to have met residency criteria, as well as to those who just haven't bothered to register, for whatever reason. The way you do this is to report to the Elections Office any time through November 1 and cast your ballot then and there.

P.S. While you're at it, why not go ahead and register so you'll be able to vote in future elections?

If you will be unable to vote in person on Election Day, you can obtain an absentee ballot by mail through a near relative, or by the one-stop absentee process. This must be done by November 1. Contact the Elections Office at 710 East Fourth Street, 374-2133.


