**Change In Hours** 

Planning to take some things to the landfill this fall? Please make note of a change in hours for the-landfill recycling and household boxes at the York Road and Harrisburg Road Landfills, effective November 1.

The boxes will be open 7 a.m. to 6 p.m., Monday through Saturday, and on Sunday, 1:30 p.m. to 6 p.m. This means the boxes will be closed one hour early, November through April. All other operating hours for the County's four landfills will remain the same.

All landfills York Road. Harrisburg Road, Holbrooks Road, and Charlotte Motor Speedway - are open from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m., Monday through Friday. The landfills on York Road and Holbrooks Road are also open from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Saturday. The Harrisburg Road Landfill is open from 7 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. on Saturday, and the landfill at the Charlotte Motor Speedway is closed on Saturday.


