chairman of the Financial Committee that is female in either the House or Senate, that I know of. The overall chairman of appropriations has never been a woman."

While she believes that "it helps to be a woman running for office" in Mecklenburg County because "there's a very strong women's movement here." Easterling, like Green, denies that being a woman candidate is enough to ensure the support of women voters. "Women don't get elected because they're women, as maybe they did in the beginning," she notes, although women will sometimes cross party lines to vote for a woman. The main thing, she says, is "you have to prove you can do the job."

For a female candidate, especially, building name recognition is important, and, once elected, "you have to do a passable job. To gain


