## Alternative Schools

Parents have only two more weeks to submit applications for their children to attend one of the five alternative schools for 1985-86. All applications must be returned to the Education Center by March 31. Students will be selected by lottery on Thursday, April 18, at 9 a.m. at the Education Center.

The system's five alternative schools are Elizabeth and Myers Park Traditional Elementary Schools, Hawthorne Traditional Junior High School, Irwin Avenue Open Elementary School and Piedmont Open Middle School. So far, the pupil assignment office has received 352 applications for Elizabeth, 425 for Myers Park, 98 for Hawthorne, 107 for Irwin Avenue and 47 for Piedmont. The number of openings in each school for next year has not been determined.


