The Dispute Settlement Program is conducting a recruitment drive for volunteer mediators. An orientation session to acquaint prospective volunteers with the program will be held on Thursday, April 11, at 7 p.m. in the parlor of Covenant Presbyterian Church, 1000 E. Morehead St.

The Dispute Settlement Program, sponsored by the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Community Relations Committee, provides a means for citizens to resolve their controversies by talking through their disputes with a trained volunteer mediator rather than going to court.

Mediators need to be good listeners, sensitive to others' needs and able to communicate without being judgmental. The role of the mediator is to help disputants arrive at a resolution rather than decide for them how it should be resolved.

At the orientation session on April 11, applications for the volunteer mediator role will be available and individual interviews will be scheduled.

a scholarship to a Mecklenburg County student planning a career in communications. Other professional groups often sponsor scholarships for students planning to enter particular professions.

Many civic groups, churches, fraternities, and sororities sponsor scholarships. At each local high school, the Honor Society and PTSA give small scholarships to a student who is strong academically but who is not getting other financial assistance.

For the majority of students, however, financial assistance comes through the financial aid office of the college they are attending, says Porter. And, while academic performance is important, most who meet college entrance requirements are able to find some kind of help from some source, whether it is an outright grant, a loan, or work-study.

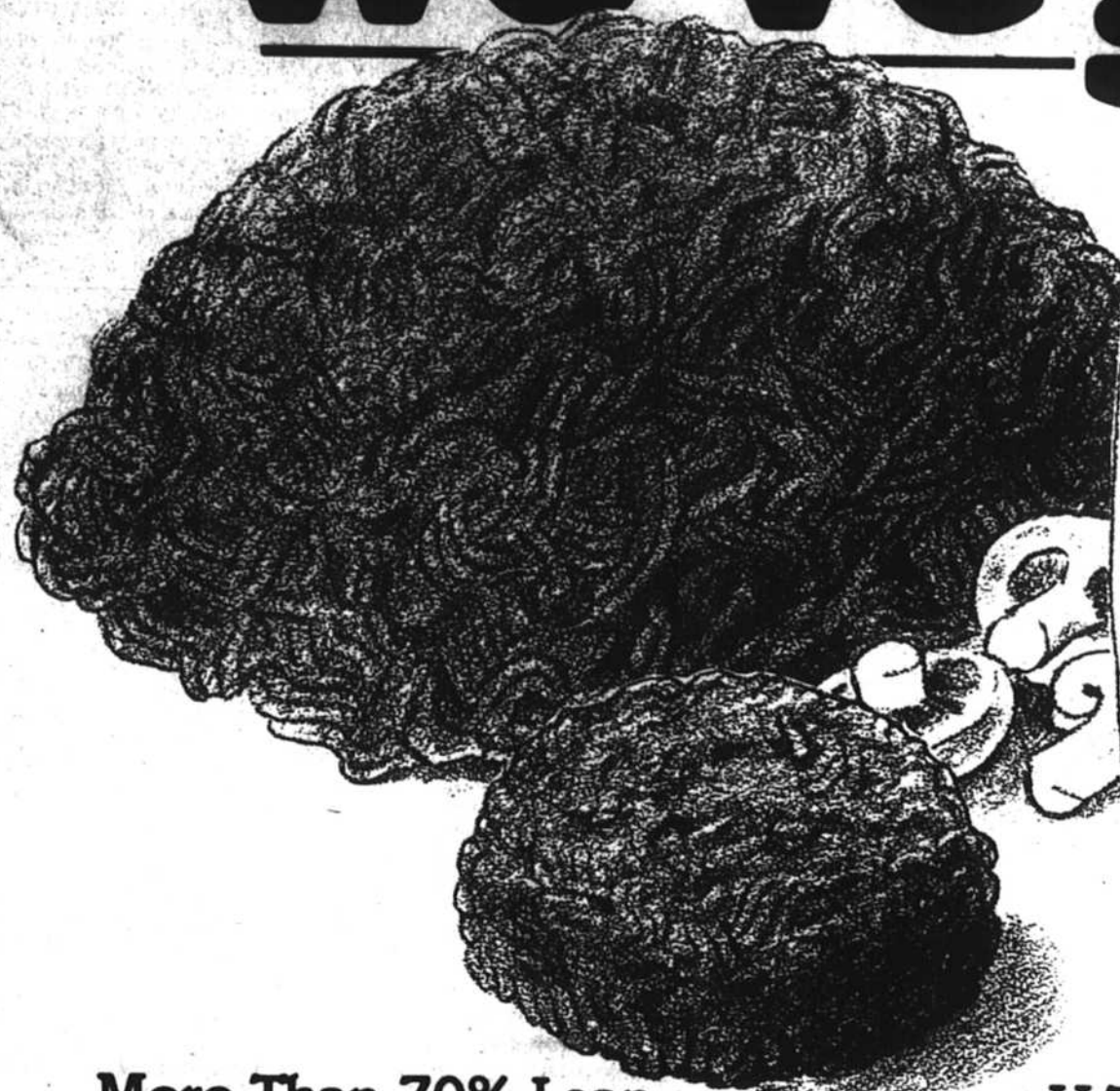
As Jo Williams puts it, "We encourage students to apply for anything they might qualify for."
