

Bus Ridership Up

The Charlotte Transit System had a 5.15 percent increase in ridership in April, 1985 over the same period in 1984. This represents 39,471 more riders and the third consecutive month of growth in transit volume.

Last month 805,582 persons used the Charlotte Transit System; ridership for April, 1984 was 766,111. The average daily volume was 22,794 compared to 21,762 for April, 1984.

The Charlotte Department of Transportation attributes the growth in ridership to new advertising campaign begun in mid-February, a targeted marketing program directed to 20,000 households, new "take one" bus information racks at area locations and normal seasonal variations.
