The faculty members who return to the classroom then pass on to both students and fellow faculty members information from the cutting edge of science, influ-encing the direction of university

Faculty members can apply for three types of energy-related Facul-ty Research Participations. In addition to summer research appoint-ments, 'sabattical leave appointments of up to nine months can be made. Faculty members can also participate on a part-time basis, up to two days per week, during the academic year at certain facilities. Last year, a program for faculty members from historically black colleges and universities, supported by DOE's Office of Health, and Environmental Research, was added, Participants chosen for these programs receive a stipend that is based on, but does not exceed, their university salary.

The application deadline for next year's appointments is January 20, 1986. Applications can be obtained from the University Programs Division, Faculty Research Partici-pation, Oak Ridge Associated Universities, P. O. Box 117, Oak Ridge, Tn. 37831-0117.

Oak Ridge Associated is a private, not-for-profit association of 49 colleges and universities. It is a contractor of the U.S. Department of Energy, conducting research and educational programs in the areas of energy, health, and the environment for the Department, ORAU's member institutions, other colleges and universities, and other private and governmental organizations.


