Among the five candidates running for one vacancy on the Charlotte-Mecklenburg School Board is Dr. Harvey Sadoff, educational director for BSC, a computer software company. Dr. Sadoff, who ran in last year's school board race, is a former professor at UNCC. His involvement with the local school system encompasses many roles: as parent, as teacher, and as an educator of teachers.

Dr. Sadoff has garnered substantial support in the black community. The candidate says this support is based on trust and on his advocacy of "black issues" in the past. He adds, "Being Jewish, I can sympathize with the plight of minorities and their situation.

Senator Mel Watt, one of those backing Dr. Sadoff, calls him "far and away the most attractive of the candidates who are running, in my assessment."

Watt adds that Sadoff has demonstrated interest in educational issues and has contributed to the educational process.

According to Sarah Coleman, who serves with Sadoff on another commission, "I think he has deep convictions and concern about education for our children.'

Dr. Raleigh Bynum, optometrist and former candidate for County Commission, is another Sadoff supporter. "We've been friends since 1980 when we were both running for public office," recalls Dr. Bynum. "I think without a doubt Harvey is by far the person we need to fill the vacancy. He is level-headed and has the ability to think things through to the end. He's obviously interested and committed."

Recalling his past unsuccessful bids for election, Dr. Sadoff notes that this time around he has the name recognition that he lacked before. "People are beginning to call me up" rather than the other way around, he says.


