

# Public Forum On Tax Reform To Be Held Next Month

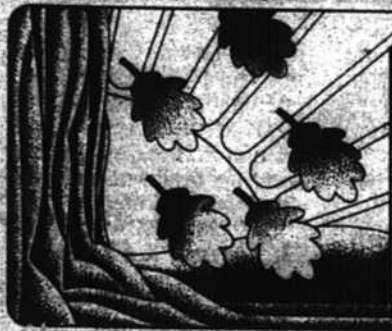
