

Johnson C. Smith Marching Band Makes Big Changes

A big change has been made by the JCSU marching band. Students are saying positive things about the band, said trumpet player Charmaine Moss.

Since 1983, the year that Freddie Holt joined the JCSU staff as band director, there have been a lot of improvements that have added to the entire music program.

Holt has done some great things with the band, such as increasing the number of band members. This year the band has a total of 70 members including auxiliaries.

Holt says, "I've been band director for two years, and 70 members is a big jump from the 35 original members."

The band has improved over 50 percent and it is continuing to grow as the year moves on. Holt recruited 40 freshmen this year, who were awarded scholarships.

The best thing that the band did was to increase the number of half-time performances. Last season the band performed only four half-time shows out of the 10 games that were played, all of them at home games. This year the band plans to perform at eight out of 10 games most of them away.
