Dr. Newsome told of her decision to make Charlotte her home and the intricacies of establishing a new private practice in a city that is dominated by male optometrists and where she had few ties before moving here.

Dr. Newsome was an assistant professor at the University of Missouri St. Louis School of Optometry and a staff consultant at the Veteran's Administration Hospital in St. Louis prior to making Charlotte her home.

The October 27 speaking engagement concluded a two-month weekend speaking tour for Dr. Newsome.

Main Library is planning a spe-


