

## Foster Grandparents And Needy Children Share A Special Kind Of Love

By Elaine Stoops Special To The Post ...Raleigh - A little blind girl was having her eyes examined at the Western Carolina Center in Morganton. The child was not respond-ing to any of the lights, colors and pictures that are used as a stimuli in such vision tests. The staff then remembered that the child loved he foster grandmother, Lucy Duckworth, and showed more reaction when Lucy was around. When Lucy came into the room, the child responded to her voice and movements and the staff was able to documen the distance and angle of her blind-

Minnie Roper volunteers 20 hours a week as a foster grandparent and still returns to the Western Carolina Center every Sunday to play the piano for church services in the cottages. She also volunteers time to assist in feeding the residents at supper, and she says she enjoys it all.

Sunshine Gibbs feeds, cares for and entertains her foster grand-children. She volunteers 20 hours of service a week, making stuffed toys and decorations for the children's wheelchairs. She also provides shamrocks or elves for St. Patrick's Day, heart-shaped pillows for Va-lentine's Day, black cat decorations for Halloween and toy Santa Clauses for Christmas.

These are just a few of the special volunteers in the Foster Grand-parent Program at the Western Carolina Center, for the mentally retarded, which was one of the ginal projects in the United S The older adults and needy children share a unique bond and a special kind of love. Their commitment and caring will be recognized on September 12 when they are honored at the Morganton Community House as part of the celebration commemorating the 20th anniversary of the Foster Grandparent Program. Children in the projects are 10 years of age or under, in need of remedial care and training, and are referred to the program by mental health professionals. Most of these children professionals. Most of these children are mentally retarded, autistic, abused, in trouble at home or with the law, and live in state mental health and mental retardation centers.

Centers. To further honor their dedication, Governor James G. Martin has pro-claimed September 1965 as Foster Grandparent Month in North Caro-lina in order to pay special tri-bute to the spirit of these special volunteers. In his proclamation, the Governor stated that "foster grand-parents make a real difference in the lives of these special children. The children and older adults learn and play together, and most imand play together, and most im-portantly share love and caring. In addition to the invaluable volunteer, service they provide to special children and to the state, foster

children and to the state, foster grandparents receive the great sa-tisfaction of helping others." There are currently four Foster Grandparent Projects in North Carolina helping approximately



1,500 children. In addition to

1,500 children. In addition to Western Carolina Center the programs include Caswell Center for the mentally retarded in Kinston; the New River Mental Health Center in Boone; and the AGES Actions Group for Economic Solvency) in Goldsboro, all of which are to be the federal agency ACTION. The North Carolina Division of Aging sponsors and revises the four projects.
Work 1600 foster grandparents function for especially needy children. The grandparents must be 60 years of age or older and in reasonably good health. They work four hours a day, five days a week, and receive a stipend of \$2 an hour, a hot meal, and an annual physical and medical check up, but most importantly they receive the grandparents. others,
