



The National Association of Broadcasters has joined forces with the Congressional Families for Drug-Free Youth to produce audio and video public service announcements (PSAs) on the dangers of drug abuse among young people. Each spot features a member of the Congressional Families organization, spouses of Members of Congress. Caroline McMillan, wife of Congressman J. Alex McMillan (R-NC), is among those who participated in the taping. The project is another facet of NAB's ongoing nationwide campaign against alcohol and drug abuse. Mrs. McMillan and 25 other Congressional wives cut the PSAs, with the message "Say No To Drugs," on the steps of the Lincoln Memorial in Washington. The tapes will be individually distributed by NAB to radio and tele-

vision stations in each member's district or state. The spots should be on-air late November. Congressional Families for Drug-Free Youth is a non-profit, anti-abuse group comprised of U.S. Senate and House of Representatives' family members. Its President is Carolyn Mattingly, wife of Senator Mack Mattingly (R-GA). A separate spot, also taped in Washington, will feature Joyce Nalepka, president, National Federation of Parents for Drug-Free Youth, who helped found the Congressional Families group. Nalepka's anti-drug PSA will be distributed to all radio and television stations by NAB. The NAB serves a membership of over 4,500 radio and 550 television stations, including all the major networks.

## IRS Emphasizes Need For Good Records

Greensboro - The Internal Revenue Service requires that you keep records which will enable you to prepare a correct tax return and pay your proper tax. If you keep a record of your expenses during the year, you may find that you are able to reduce your taxes by itemizing deductions. You must keep a record of expenses to support any deductions you claim. Deductible expenses may include a part of your medical and dental bills, interest payments, contributions, taxes, and certain other expenses.

According to the IRS, you should keep all sales slips, invoices, receipts, cancelled checks, stock brokerage statements, W-2s, 1099s, and other documents which prove the amounts you show on your return as

income, deductions, and credits.

Your record must be kept available for examination by the IRS if your return is selected for an audit. If you have kept good records you should be able to prove any deductions which are questioned. If you have not kept good records, you may have to pay more tax because you cannot prove your deductions.

Usually an audit occurs within three years after a return is filed. Copies of returns and supporting records should be kept at least three years. For more information on recordkeeping requirements, call 1-800-241-3860 and ask for Publication 552.
