

Basketball season is just around the corner. On Monday, November 25, Harding and Myers Park open the season at the Mustang gym.

On Tuesday, November 26, R.S. Central is at Crest, Ashbrook at West, South at Olympic, North Gaston at East Gaston, East Rutherford at North, and Shelby at Hunter Huss.

On Wednesday, November 27, Olympic is at Myers Park and Anson County is at Independence.

The conference season begins on January 7 with Ashbrook at Garinger, Myers Park at Independence, and South at Hunter Huss in the Southwestern 4A Conference race.

The Tri-County race begins the same night with West at North, Harding at Crest, and West Charlotte at Olympic.

East Gaston's first conference game will be January 10 " when North visits, East Mecklenburg's first conference

beginning December 28. North and Independence will be in the Cel River tournament in Rock Hill beginning December 27.

Charlotte's Finest Charlotte Post's 1985 All-Metropolitan Team

You could take this team and lick the dickins out of the South Carolina Shrine Bowl squad in December without any problems. They are a talented bunch who have displayed their wares throughout a grueling football season that has seen a record four Mecklenburg County teams in the state playoffs - In dependence, Harding, West Char-lotte, and Charlotte Catholic.

Our player of the year said that his team dedicated its season to Carl Williams, a very gifted young ath-lete who drowned while at a motel in Greensboro practicing for the East-West All-Star game.

"We said this summer that we would dedicate our 1985 season to Carl and we yowed that in his memory we would like to go 10-0," said Anthony Houston of Harding High School.

And, now after 1,659 passing yards, 14 touchdowns and an unbeaten regular season at 10-0, he vows that the dream is not complete.

"We would like to win the state championship," he added. "We have the team that can do it."

Harding romped through the new Tri-County league composed of Olympic, Harding, East Gaston, Crest, West Charlotte, and North Mecklenburg to become its first regular season champion.

They were only tested once when they were down by a 9-5 score with West Charlotte threatening with under three minutes left in the

fourth quarter. The defense held. With lightening speed, Houston passed to one of his favorite receivers, Danny McKay, who lateraled back to Antonio Walker and the Rams were on their way to a 19-9 victory.

Houston, a junior, is our first All-Metropolitan Football Player of the Year. His team entered the second round of the playoffs with a 16-6 win over South Rowan.

Tommy Knotts of Harding is the first Metropolitan Coach of the Year.

"We have played very well this year," said Knotts. "Houston had an outstanding year and we seemed to be able to reach within when we had to and pull out the big ballgames."

Houston is joined on the first team by his favorite receiver, Kenny Stevenson, who caught 39 passes and East Mecklenburg receiver Tony Hamer.

The running backs on the All-Metropolitan First Team All-Offensive unit are Broderick Graves of West Charlotte, Junior Hall of Ashbrook, and Donald Ray Celson of North Mecklenburg.

Graves has 4.5 speed and rushed for 1,430 yards and 16 touchdowns. His team has entered the second round of the state playoffs with a 19-0 victory over Independence.


