## Delivery Of Unsolicited Printed Materials Restricted

An amendment to the ordinance regarding the unwanted soliciting of handbills, circulars, and other printed materials went into effect recently. The ordinance amendment was approved unanimously by City Council.

The ordinance amendment outlines and instructs the process a resident can take to stop the delivery of unsolicited printed materials (newspapers, magazines, handbills, etc.) to his or her private property. The amendment specifies, "If the person in control of private property wishes the delivery of unsolicited printed material discontinued, he or she may request the person, firm or corporation responsible for the printing, publishing or distribution to stop delivery by sending such request in writing by certified mail to the appro-

priate person. The request shall become effective fourteen (14) days after receipt of the written request. Continued delivery of such material shall be upon the second delivery, unlawful and a violation of this ordinance, provided the second

delivery occurs within 180 days after the request becomes effective." "This is not to be interpreted as being anti-unsolicited material," states Barbara Gammon, Executive Coordinator of Charlotte Clean City Committee.

ing and voice its opinion on a number of topics. Are people satisfied with the type of programming on cablevision? Is the cost of cablevision too expensive?

These are just a few of the issues the committee would like to hear opinions on, but it takes an involved public to achieve that goal.
