# Al Jarreau - Live In London To Air Wednesday Night

Multi-Grammy Award-winning jazz vocalist Al Jarreau performs before a capacity audience in the concert special, "Al Jarreau: Live in London," Jarreau: Live in London," broadcast at 10 p.m. on Wednesday, March 5. Jarreau's stylish combination of jazz, rhythm and blues and selfwritten romantic lyrics have earned him countless awards and accolades, as well as a series of gold and platinum albums. "Al Jarreau: Live in London" is an unforgettable visual document of this dynamic and soulful performer.

Jarreau's unerring instinct for the heart of a song comes searing through as he performs some of his best-known hits, including "We're in This Love Together," "Let's Pretend," "High Crime," "Raging Waters," "Trouble in Paradise," "Our Love," "Take Five," "Boogie Down," and "Roof Garden."

Jarreau, who has earned a reputation as an artist of depth and substance,

began singing at the age of four. The native Milwau-kean performed in local clubs and jazz festivals while earning a degree in psychology at Ripon College in Wisconsin. In 1975 he was signed to a recording contract, and his debut album, "We Got By," was

released to unanimous acclaim.

Jarreau received a
Germany Grammy for
Best New International
Soloist in 1975. In 1976 his
second album, "Glow,"
earned him a second Germany Grammy. In 1977 and
1979 he received American
Grammy Awards for Best
Jazz Vocalist. He garnered two more Grammy
Awards in 1982 for Best
Male Pop Vocalist and
Best Male Jazz Vocalist.
Jarreau has been named
Male Vocalist and Best
New Jazz Act by Performance magazine and Jarreau received

New Jazz Act by Per-formance magazine and Vocalist of the Year by the French Music Academy. Cashbox, Downbeat, and Stereo Review magazines all have singled him out for lop spots in their annual music awards.
