

Bethlehem Center Project Headstart Accepting Applications

During April, applications will be taken by the Social Services Component of the Bethlehem Center Project Head Start for the 1988-87 program year.

Low income, pre-school children ages three, four and children who will be five after October 16, 1988, are eligible for the comprehensive child development program. Head Start serves handicapped children regardless of their income.

To apply, a parent or guardian must provide proof of income such as 1985 income tax form, 1985 W-2 forms, statement from employer, Veteran's Benefits, Social Security, Child Support, unemployment bene-

fits, or Aid to Families with Dependent Children award letter. The child's shot record and birth certificate are needed along with a current copy (12 months) of your child's physical. Head Start will need a copy of child's physical examination within two weeks of enrollment.

Smith, a senior at Myers Park High School, is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Ned Britt Smith of 4019 Chevington Road, Charlotte.

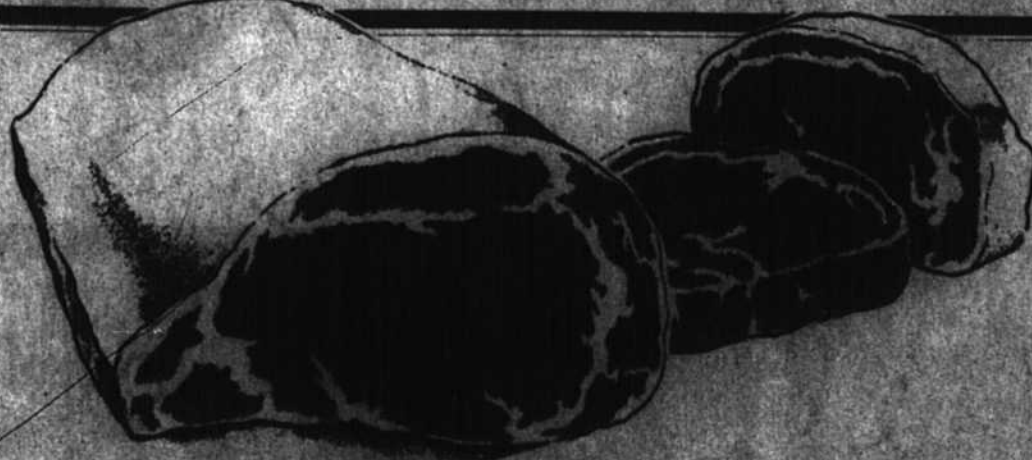
