

# Black Publishers Condemn Attempts To Ban Tobacco Advertising

 Washington, DC - The nation's principal organization of black newspaper publishers has condemned recent proposals that tobacco advertising be banned in the print media.  
 The 165-member National Newspaper Publishers Association (NNPA) termed such efforts "an infringement upon first amendment rights," and the publishers described themselves as firmly

committed to "the enforcement of all constitutional rights."  
 In a resolution approved in principle by the membership in January and made public recently, the black newspaper publishers argued that smoking issues should be addressed through "increased education and not by the elimination of advertising in newspapers and other publications."  
 In addition, the resolution said "tobacco products have already

been banned from radio and television advertising without any appreciable reduction in sales."  
 The American Medical Association's (AMA) recent call for a Federal ban on tobacco advertising in all media has been the object of considerable discussion during the NNPA's recent Mid-Winter Workshop.  
 Christopher H. Bennett, President of the NNPA and publisher of The Seattle Medium, appointed a special

committee to prepare a resolution that would express the concerns of the publishers about proposals to ban tobacco advertising.  
 The resolution said: "The production of tobacco in the United States is legal and the manufacture and sale of tobacco products are legal. Products that can be legally sold in our society are entitled to be legally advertised."  
 Founded in 1940, the NNPA's membership comes, for the most

part, from the larger of the nation's more than 400 black, weekly newspapers. Headquartered in Washington, DC, the Association functions to keep its membership up to date on a variety of industry matters, including marketing techniques and printing technology. It functions, as well, to provide the publishers with a network for the exchange of ideas.

## Bush-Olatunji Cites Women Who Serve As Role Models

New York-based lecturer, consultant, and author Ammiebelle Bush-Olatunji was the featured speaker at a meeting on black women role models on April 1 at McDonald's Cafeteria. The meeting was sponsored by the Minority Affairs Commission, the Black Women's Caucus, and the National Association of Negro Business and Professional Women.  
 A second meeting to be hosted by the Black Women's Caucus is planned for Sunday, April 27, 3 p.m., at Greenville Community Center. To be addressed is the question of identifying black women role models as well as who could benefit from such role models.  
 According to Assistant County Manager Sherry Suttles, who participated in the earlier meeting, possible projects to include role models are the restoration of the shotgun houses located behind the Afro-American Cultural Center and increased self-sufficiency in health care. A major goal would be to develop leadership.  
 Bush-Olatunji, a native of Prichard, Alabama, is married to a Nigerian and has traveled back and forth to Nigeria for 28 years. She and her husband co-founded the Olatunji Center of Africal Culture, formerly located in Harlem.  
 The former librarian cited numerous black women who served as role models for her. Referring to herself as an "idea person," Bush-Olatunji described the purpose of the meetings as "reaching into each person's own soul to come up with how black women can unite and work together to the advantage of all spiritually, economically, and through education and everyday lifestyles."
