Rev. William Lee Honored For 20 Years Exemplary Leadership

Sunday. Rev. Lee, it is said, "Possesses great leadership ability and has an unusual talent for planning special programs with high color and promoting them with unbelievable success." For 20 years he has lived up to this praise and his energies directed towards further-ing the success of his church remain unabated. His latest achievements include planning and fundraising for a \$75,000 softball and playing field to be constructed in the Arrowood community and a \$2 million church building, in the same area, to house Silver Mount Baptist. He is the founder of the well-known "Glimpse of Hope Broadcast" heard for 18 years over WGIV Radio Station.
