E.C. Cannon Crusade To Conduct Seminars, Workshops, Counseling

The E.C. Cannon Crusade began at Cannon's Cathedral this week and will last through Sunday, July 20, with programs each day.

This evangelistic crusade, formed and organized by Rev. E. C. Cannon, is a nonprofit, non-denominational event open to all who wish to attend any one of its functions.

"Whatever you're looking for, whatever you need spiritually, will be offered during the crusade," commented a Cannon's Cathedral spokesperson. "There will be seminars, workshops, and counseling."

With delegates from North and South Carolina, Illinois and Virginia, 1,200 to 1,400 people arrive for this crusade each year. Each night there will be different guest speakers and various choirs with the home choir of Cannon's Cathedral opening the service nightly. This Saturday and Sunday, July 19 and 20, a special appearance will be made by the Hawaiian Holy Ghost Band from Charleston, S.C.

A native of Asheville, N.C., Rev. Cannon began this crusade in Maxton, N.C., 39 years ago. He later founded Cannon's Cathedral, located at 200 Tuckaseegee Rd., and has been in Charlotte for the last 24 years.

Cannon Cathedral has established several outreach ministries including programs for senior citizens, food and clothing drives, a prison ministry and the E.C. Cannon Child Development Center. There is, additionally, a radio broadcast ministry heard over WGSP in Charlotte and a television ministry seen on WCCB, Channel 18, and cable channel 3 in Charlotte.

Cannon's Cathedral is affiliated with the Church of God and Christ Pentecostal Holiness with national headquarters in Memphis, Tennessee.
