Last year the Golden Bulls were on the road for five straight games and it took the steam out of the season.

The Bulls were fifth in

They were 10th in passing, ninth in total offense, eighth in scoring with 13.4 points per game, third in rushing defense, giving up only 803 yards or 80.3
