Macedonia Baptist Church Honors Rev. L.J. Wallace On 27th Anniversary

"The main responsibility of a pastor is to preach and teach in the way of the Lord," claims Rev. L.J. Wallace who has found assurance that he's lived up to this responsibility by noting the spiritual growth of his congregation.

Rev. Wallace has been the pastor of Macedonia Baptist Church for 27 years. And through the years since his installment at Macedonia in 1969, the church has acquired much in the way of material growth. However, Wallace is more appreciative of his "wonderful" congregation that has "persevered through the struggles and have been cooperative and supportive" during his ministry.

Mutual feelings of esteem emanate from the congregation of Macedonia to their pastor and they will honor Rev. Wallace this week on his anniversary.

The first service of the celebration will take place on Friday, September 5, at 7 p.m. This will be Youth Night with the young people of Macedonia in charge of the service. Rev. A.B. Sutton, Jr., associate pastor of Ebenezer Baptist Church, will be the guest speaker. A choir from Ebenezer will render song for the occasion.

Then, on Sunday, September 7, the observance continues at 11 a.m. when Rev. Perone Griffin, assistant pastor of Macedonia, delivers the Worship Service Sermon.

Dinner will be served at 1 p.m., immediately following the morning service.

At a 2:30 p.m. service, Rev. David Cook, pastor of Liberty Hill Baptist Church, Waxhaw, N.C., will be guest preacher. He will be accompanied by his choirs and congregation. There will also be several other visiting choirs present at the celebration.

Under Rev. Wallace's leadership, among other things, a new Macedonia Church edifice was erected in 1983. Since that time the church has also purchased a van for the transportation of its elderly members; has begun operation of a community center; and has purchased four homes located in the vicinity of the church.

"I thank the Lord for all we've been able to accomplish," comments Rev. Wallace. "And I still foresee greater heights we can attain. There are no limits."

Rev. Wallace maintains an exceptional rapport with his approximately 300 member congregation and he expresses his hopes for the congregation as thus: "I aspire for the members of my church to become sincere about venturing beyond the walls of the church, going out into the community and throughout the city, spreading the word of the Lord."

Married to Victoria Erwin, Rev. Wallace has six children and four grandchildren.

All are urged to attend the Appreciation and Anniversary Service for Rev. Wallace this Sunday. Macedonia is located at 1300 Hatteras Avenue.
