

Sponsor Scholarships For Community Volunteers

...Winston-Salem - RJR Nabisco, Inc. and the Center for Creative Leadership will jointly sponsor 10 scholarships for North Carolina volunteer - community leaders in programs designed to improve leadership skills and working relationships.

Recipients for the RJR Nabisco Scholarships for Community Leadership will be those who give their time and talents to school boards, town councils, county commissions, or other organizations that affect the quality of community life.

A selection preference will be given to women and minorities or to those working with minorities or minority programs. Applications for 1986 programs are now being accepted.

Two scholarships will be awarded in each of North Carolina's five major geographic regions, one scholarship per region for the Leadership Development Program and the other for the program Working With Others: A Management Process.

Both programs are offered at the Center for Creative Leadership in Greensboro. The participant or sponsoring organization will be asked to pay 10 percent of program related expenses, approximately \$33 for the Leadership Development Program and \$120 for Working With Others.

The Leadership Development Program is a week-long workshop designed to help individuals to identify, practice, and

identify, practice, and improve their leadership skills. Participants learn by experiencing first-hand the demands and challenges of leadership. Through a assessment and constructive feedback, they become more aware of their abilities and areas that need improvement.

Working With Others is a threeday workshop for supervisors, managers, or team leaders who want to build productive working relationships. The workshop addresses three critical areas of supervision: getting peak performance from workers, leading work groups, and handling interpersonal relationships.

The Center for Creative Leadership is a nonprofit educational institution founded in 1970 in Greensboro. Its mission is to encourage and develop creative leadership and effective management for the good of society overall.




The Golfers of America recently sponsored its sixth annual golf tournament at Eastwood Golf Club. Pictured above are W.C. Funderburk, director of
