McLeod Is "Woman Of Year"

Wilmington - Dr. Jonnie McLeod, pediatrician and professor of Human Services at UNC-Charlotte, was named the Woman of the Year for 1985 by the North Carolina Foundation for Alcohol and Drug Studies. She was selected because of her participation and leadership on the 1985 Governor's Task Force on Alcohol and Drug Abuse Among Youth. Dr. McLeod presently chairs the Governor's Council on Alcohol and Drug Abuse Among Children and Youth.

Criteria for the award include developing a positive image for alcohol and drug programs, impacting the most people within North Carolina, possessing significant leadership for change in the profession and demonstrating a considerable knowledge base through significant advancements in the field of drug and alcohol abuse.

An original member of the Mecklenburg Mental Health Authority, Dr. McLeod is the founder and first director of the Charlotte Drug Education Center. She also is founder of Open House, Inc., a substance abuse treatment center in Charlotte. The Jonnie McLeod Residential Treatment Center at Open House was

named in honor of her contributions.
