8. NORTH MECKLENBURG VIKINGS - The Vikings


8. NORTH MECKLENBURG VIKINGS - The Vikings are still in the running. Defensive back Bobby Moore is one of the best around. The young man can really hit.

Providence Day's Reginald Clark is an awesome speciman. Reggie has seven touchdowns this season and his team is 4-0 overall and 2-0 in the Western Independent League.
