The Voices of Elks Choir will be in concert at South Tryon Presbyterian Church on Sunday, January 18, at 4 p.m.

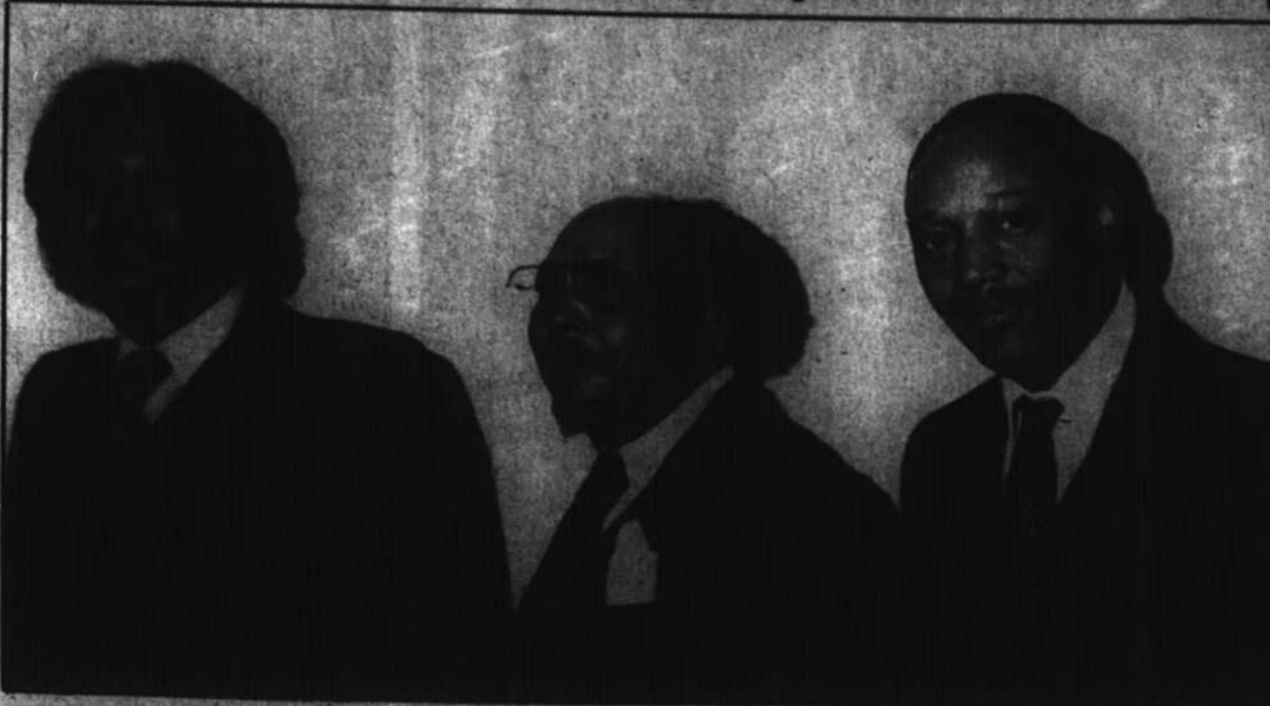

Discuss Bible Translations

Hickory - The Lenoir-Rhyne College Saturday Seminar series begins its 1987 schedule on Saturday, January 17, with a lecture and discussion entitled "Modern Translations of the Bible."

The seminar will be led by Dr. Rufus Moretz, professor of religion at Lenoir-Rhyne and religion department chairperson. The course will explain reasons for differences between various translations of the Bible and compare and evaluate eight contemporary translations including the Revised Standard version, the Jerusalem Bible, Today's English version, the New International version, the New American Bible, the New English Bible, the

Living Bible and the New King James version.

The Saturday Seminar series is offered through Lenoir-Rhyne's Lifelong Education office and explores a new topic each month throughout the school year.

Registration for the "Modern Translations of the Bible" seminar begins at 9 a.m. with coffee and doughnuts in the lobby of the Rhyne Building. The seminar registration fee is \$10 and includes coffee breaks and lunch in the college cafeteria following the discussion.

CPCC Instructor Receives State Award

Ronald C. Gyles, a retired Central Piedmont Community College instructor, was recently named the state's "Outstanding Engineering Educator."

The award is presented annually by the North Carolina Council of the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE).

The council noted Gyles' exemplary work and dedication to the school, where he served on the faculty for 19 years. In 1963, he established CPCC's Electrical and Electronics Technology programs and was later responsible for the innovative design of the programs' current laboratories.

As a senior member of IEEE, Gyles founded the college's student chapter of the professional organization and served as faculty advisor for 15 years. The educator continues to teach at CPCC occasionally on a part-time basis.

This marked the second time Gyles had been honored by IEEE for his work in education. He also received the Outstanding Engineering Educator award from the Charlotte chapter last year.

A registered professional engineer, Gyles holds bachelor's and master's degrees from North Carolina State University.
