INTRODUCTION

Pilate was a practical politician. He shared the Roman regard for justice, but it took second place to his concern for his career. Rather than endanger his position as governor, he gave in to pressure and ordered Jesus crucified. Pilate was troubled by the unusual events of that upsetting day when Jesus died. First, his wife's dream warned him, "Have thou nothing to do with that just man." Then he heard that Jesus claimed to be the Son of God and he was frightened. Pilate's fears were not ended when Jesus was nailed to the cross. At noon the sun was darkened, and night was over the land. For three hours it remained, and the terrifying climax of an earthquake. With all these fearsome events added to the accusation of his conscience, Pilate must have been a very unhappy ruler.

LESSON BACKGROUND

So the sun went down, the troubled day ended, and suddenly it was the Sabbath. But for the Jewish rulers there was still no rest. Jesus had said He would rise on the third day. What if His disciples would hide his body and announce that He had risen? The rulers said to Pilate. "Command therefore that the sepulchre be made sure until the third day." Pilate gave them a detachment of his soldiers, saying, "Go your way, make it as sure as ye can." So they went, and made the sepulchre sure, sealing the stone, and setting a watch.

THE LESSON "The women who had followed Jesus from Galilee went "The women who had followed Jesus from Gaillee went with Joseph and saw the tomb and how Jesus' body was placed in it. Then they went back home and prepared the spices and perfumes for the body. On the Sabbath they rested, as the Law commanded. Very early on Sunday morning the women went to the tomb, carrying spices they had prepared. They found the stone rolled away from the entrance to the tomb, so they went in; but they did not find the body of Jesus. They stood there puzzled about this, when suddenly two men in bright, shining clothes stood by them. Full of fear, the women bowed down to the ground, as the men said to them, Why are you looking among the dead for one who is alive? He is not here; he has been raised. Remember what he said to you while he was in Galilee: The son of Man must be handed over to sinful men, be crucified, and three days later rise to life." Then the women remembered his words, returned from the tomb, and told all these things to the eleven disciples and all the rest. The women were Mary Magdalene, Joanna, and Mary the mother of James: they and the other women with them told these things to the apostles. But the apostles thought that what the women said was nonsense, and they did not believe them." (Luke 25:55-56; 24:1-11).

Through most of Jesus' ministry the twelve apostles were lis closest followers, but also devoted to Him were some faithful women. These women were grateful because they "had been healed of evil spirits and infirmities," and to express their gratitude they not only followed Jesus to hear His teaching, but also "ministered unto him of their substance." Some of them were probably wealthy and they may have provided food often for Jesus and the apostles.


The apostles were practical men. When excited women came running with a story of shining angels who said Jesus had risen, these men just shook their wise heads. True the body was not in the tomb but that did not mean that he was alive again. They knew Jesus had died and accepted no wild story that He was alive again. Fortunately, that did not end the matter. Evidence piled up until it could not be disbe-

Can you imagine how frustrating it was for Joanna and the two Marys to tell the joyous truth only to be disbelieved? Many people take pride in their "scientific" minds. Their disbelief is unshakable. Then there are many who prefer to think that the dead stay dead. All the greedy ones who lie, steal and defraud do not want to think of life beyond the grave, for such thoughts carry the fear of judgment. So the selfish mind is closed against any teaching of a resurrection.

Do we cherish some faulty beliefs-beliefs that are not wrong, but are one-sided? Are we so devoted to such beliefs that we close our minds to another side of truth? A onceardent Christian has dropped out of the church. Why? He gave in to temptation and committed a serious sin. Almost immediately he regretted it, but he believes his sin has put him beyond forgiveness and redemption. The Bible says, "If we sin willfully after that we have received the knowledge of truth, there remaineth no more sacrifice for sins but a certain fearful looking for a judgment and fiery indignation, which shall devour the adversaries." (Hebrews 10:26, 27).

What the Bible says is true, and he is right to believe it. But his belief is faulty, incomplete, unless he also believes that "if we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. (I John 1:9). The way of truth is not to choose one verse of Scripture and discard another; it is that we see how all the Scriptures fit together in the plan of God.

Atlanta, Ga. - Arthur Marshall Jr., Bishop of the A.M.E. Zion Church, died April 3. Marshall

Marshall is survived by his wife, the former Mary Ann Stotts of the home; one son, Arthur Clifford Marshall III of the home; one niece: Delores Reese of Hampton, Virginia; four nephews: Robert J. Brown and William R. Marshall of High Point, North Carolina, Herman Reese of Hampton, Virginia, and Jerome Reese of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

Funeral services were held Wednesday, April 8, at St. Stephen A.M.E. Zion Church, 1012 Leonard Street, High Point, North Carolina. Burial followed at Carolina Biblical Gardens Cemetery in Jamestown, North Carolina.

Bishop Arthur Marshall Jr. was born in High Point, North Carolina. After attending William Penn High School in High Point, he obtained his B.A. at Livingstone College in Salisbury, North Carolina, received his M.A. from Boston University Graduate School, his S.T.B. from Boston University School of Theology, his D.D. from Livingstone College, and his LL.D from Clinton Junior College.

As Presiding Bishop of the Sixth Episcopal District of the A.M.E. Zion Church, his pastoral assignments were comprised of West Central North Carolina; Pee Dee and Palmetto, South Carolina; Georgia and South Georgia Conferences.

Prior to being elected to the office of Bishop at the General Conference of the A.M.E. Zion Church in Mobile, Alabama, in May 1972,

he was the Presiding Elder for Pine Bluff District; Arkansas Conference. His pastoral assignments were Greensboro District, West Central North Carolina Conference; Providence, Rhode Island; Ansonia, Connecticut; New England Conference; Syracuse, New York; Western New York Conference; Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania; Allegheney Conference; Kansas City and St. Louis, Missouri; and Missouri Conference.

While pastoring in St. Louis, Missouri, he served as president of the NAACP Executive Committee, and was a member of the Citizens Committee for Social Action, Board of Directors of the YMCA, National Advisory Council on Minority Business Enterprise, and the Small Business Enterprise Administration of the United States of America.

As a leader in the civil rights movement, his efforts led to the desegregation of lunch counters and restaurants in drug and department stores in the state of Missouri. His fight against de facto segregation in the St. Louis Public School System led to increased opportunities for teachers and administrators of all races.

Marshall received many meritorious awards for outstanding community service. Both the states of Alabama and Louisiana made him an honorary member of their Legislative Assemblies. The Mayor of Tuskegee, Alabama, presented him an award for outstanding community service. Honorary citizenships were awarded to him along with Keys to the Cities from mayors across the nation. The President of the West African Nation of Liberia made him a Knight of the Order of African Liberation.

More recently, he was honored at a dinner in High Point, North Carolina, in November, 1986, commemorating his 50th anniversary with the A.M.E. Zion Church. More than 1,000 people participated in the celebration where High Point Mayor Judy Mendenhall proclaimed November 21, 1986 Bishop Arthur Marshall Jr. Day, and a representative for the Governor of North Carolina brought greetings and congratulations from the State. Letters came from President Reagan, Vice President Bush, governors, senators and congressmen.

driven out into eternity, one day that will be


